ALABAMA

A Birmingham institution, Jim 'N Nick's Community Bar-B-Q sells the makings for its celebrated side dish in homespun sacks of Cheese Biscuit Mix. Just add "Enjoy!" tags-and leave the butter to your guests (\$6, jimnnicks.com).

ALASKA

Quarried and cut from in-state rock. each Natural Sandstone Coaster is unique. Give one with an ice-cold beverage to beat the dry heat (\$4 each for 100 to 300 coasters, arizonagifts.com).



ARKANSAS



Guests won't "mine" leaving the Natural State if they receive **Quartz Clusters** from Jim Coleman Crystal Mines—one of the area's most renowned keepsakes (\$180/flat of 35, jim colemancrystals.com).

CALIFORNIA

No need to turn to France when the lush Napa Valley—and its Honig Vineyard and Winery—is nearby. The 2014 sauvignon blanc makes a crisp, fresh summer sipper (\$15.25 each for 12 bottles or more, honigwine.com).



COLORADO



Fuel day-after hikes (and help any lingering hangovers) with Olde Man Granola, hand-baked in eight flavors, including a mix free of gluten and nuts (\$6 for 12 oz. olde mangranola.com).

HAWAII

Grown on the west coast of the island for decades, Maui Coffee Co. Maui beans brew up a rich, dark cup that can be enjoyed with coconut milk, as the locals do (\$8 each for 12 or more, mauicoffeeco.com).

KANSAS

Sunny Seeds Chocolate-Covered Sunflower Seeds commemorate the state's flower-and one of its biggest crops—with a colorful, crunchy confection (\$1.25 for 1 oz, sunflower foodcompany.com).

CONNECTICUT

Bells will be ringing from the moment you say "I do" with chimes from a custom Bevin Bros. Brass Tea Bell, produced by a historic family firm and topped with New England wood (from \$7.50 each, bevinbells.com).



IDAHO



KENTUCKY

Natives sip Knob Creek Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey on the rocks or with mint sugar, and water for a

DELAWARE

Rehoboth brewpub-turned-brewery Dogfish Head crafts many good ales, but we suggest Midas Touch for a special draft—it's nothing short of liquid gold (from \$2.75 a bottle, totalwine.com).



ILLINOIS

LOUISIANA


NEW JERSEY
