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OVERVIEW

- Academic and professional career has uniquely bridged the physical sciences, archaeology, and the humanities
- Pioneered rapidly developing, interdisciplinary field of biomolecular archaeology. This field is at the technological cutting-edge of modern archaeology--bridging the sciences and humanities--as best illustrated by ancient wine and food cultures
- Developed innovative academic program in the archaeological sciences
- Seminal studies on the earliest chemical evidence of grape wine (ca. 6000 B.C.), barley beer, and Royal Purple
- Re-creation of the "King Midas" funerary feast, the first time that a historic meal has been reconstructed from the chemical analysis of ancient organic residues
- On-going studies on grape and yeast DNA, prehistoric Chinese fermented beverages (rice, millet, honey, and fruit-based), ancient medicines and anticancer effects, New World chocolate, Old World almond, and early wine, ranging from Neolithic villages in the Taurus and Caucasus Mountains to Iron Age shipwrecks in the eastern Mediterranean Sea
- Directed major excavations in Jordan, and collaborated on projects throughout Europe, the Middle East, and Asia
